UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

A) Library Hours

The Board reviewed results of the current survey on open hours and discussed the practice of closing the library on Saturdays in summer. Standard practice for many years has been to close on summer Saturdays; however, there has not been a corresponding reduction in staff hours or operating costs. It does not save money to close the library and would not cost to keep it open. It was noted that no other Class IV or Class V library in Michigan closes on Saturdays in summer (Escanaba is class IV). Staff concerns were discussed as well as any potential issues that may arise with staying open. P. Green made a motion that the board support a recommendation that the library remain open to the public on Saturdays year-round, seconded by J. Hallett/Unanimous.

B) Library Strategic Plan 2014-2019

The strategic plan continues to be a working document for library administration. Current priorities from the plan are the development of a comprehensive marketing plan, improving public access to library services by increasing open hours.



Program explores science, math, arts

ESCANABA — Escanaba Upper Elementary (EUE) fourth-through sixth-graders got charged up with static electricity during the final session of the STEAM pro-

gram recently at the Escanaba Public Library.

STEAM, which is an acronym for Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics, has been happening at the litrary twice amount on Tuesdays since March. The STEAM program accumulat-

ed 20 EUE students. Students participated in different STEAMrelated activities throughout the year including balloon rockets and rocket launchers and a miniature robot that could draw a picture.
