
## CITY OF ESCANABA RECREATION DEPARTMENT HAS FACILITIES AVAILABLE FOR RENT



**LUDINGTON PARK PAVILION**—The Ludington Park Pavilion is located near the south end of the 120 acre Ludington Park. The Pavilion support facilities include: Ample 110-volt electric service, potable water for cooking/cleaning and a large capacity barbeque grill. The facility is capable of accommodating 10 eight-person picnic tables with ample green space in the surrounding area to facilitate additional tables/persons. Clean, modern restroom facilities are located conveniently close to the Pavilion. Parking accommodations are also close by at the tennis court lot, Jenkin’s Drive or the Band Shell parking lot.

Advance reservations required for family socials, picnics and outings. One-half day reservation fee of \$75 resident and \$100 non-resident. Half-day reservation can be made before or after 4:00 p.m. Full day reservation fee of \$100 resident and \$125 non-resident .

**LUDINGTON PARK GAZEBO**—The Gazebo is located across from the Sand Point Lighthouse near the east end of Ludington Park. The 20’ x 20’ Gazebo is equipped with both internal and external electrical outlets and external lighting for subtle nighttime illumination. Many people have found the Ludington Park Gazebo an excellent location for wedding ceremonies, wedding pictures and family reunion pictures. This facility provides beautiful views of the Ludington Park Fountain and the Harbor. On-street parking is available. Restrooms are nearby at the Municipal Marina.



Advance reservations required for wedding ceremonies, family/group pictures, etc. \$50 fee per two-hour block for resident and \$75 for non-resident.

**LUDINGTON PARK BAND SHELL**—The Band Shell is a multi-use facility capable of accommodating performances, plays, concerts, religious functions and other ceremonies and social events. Located on the south end of Ludington Park, the facility is capable of seating 300 people with a large expanse of green area and hills to accommodate hundreds of other spectators. Support facilities for the Band Shell include parking for approximately 100 vehicles and restroom facilities immediately north of the Band Shell area.

Advanced reservations required for use of the Ludington Park Band Shell. One-half day reservation fee of \$75 for resident and \$100 for non-resident. Half-day reservations can be made before or after 4:00 p.m. Full-day reservation fee of \$100 for resident and \$125 for non-resident.

Escanaba Public Library today announced that Monica McFawn--author of “Bright Shards of Someplace Else”—will visit the library at 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, June 4, for an author talk and book signing.


McFawn is visiting the Escanaba Public Library as part of the Library of Michigan’s **2015** “Michigan Notable Authors Tour.” This year, 20 authors whose engaging works were chosen as 2015 Michigan Notable Books selections will visit nearly 50 libraries throughout the state.

“This year’s Michigan Notable Books delve into wonderfully diverse topics and offer something of interest for just about everyone,” said State Librarian Randy Riley. “The tour offers the opportunity for book enthusiasts in many corners of the state to join in the conversation about what constitutes ‘great writing’ and to hear from some of the Great Lakes region’s most beloved authors.”

Monica McFawn’s fiction has appeared in the *Georgia Review*; *Gettysburg Review*; *Web Conjunctions*; *Missouri Review* and others. Her collection of short stories, *Bright Shards of Someplace Else*, won the Flannery O’Connor Award for Short Fiction. She is also the author of a hybrid chapbook, *A Catalogue of Rare Movements* and her plays and screenplays have had readings in Chicago and New York. Monica lives in Michigan and will be beginning a new position as an Assistant Professor at Northern Michigan University starting in the fall of 2015.

Michigan Notable Books is designed to promote reading and raise awareness of Michigan’s literary heritage. The program annually selects 20 of the most outstanding books published in that year – titles that are reflective of Michigan’s diverse ethnic, historical, literary and cultural experience.

The 2015 Michigan Notable Books program and tour are made possible thanks to the generous support of the Library of



Michigan, the Library of Michigan Foundation, Michigan Department of Education, the Michigan Humanities Council, Meijer, the Michigan Center for the Book and the Friends of the Escanaba Public Library. ### Regular Council Meeting, May 7, 2015

3. Approved a resolution recognizing the Upper Peninsula Steam and Gas Association as a nonprofit organization operating in the community for the purpose of obtaining a charitable gaming license from the State of Michigan.
4. Approved two contracts to install high speed internet to the Whitetail Industrial Park.
5. Approved three year centerline/edge line painting bid to PK Contracting of Lake City, MI.
6. Approved the construction of a 5' (+/-) x 18'6' (+/-) handicap ramp on City right-of-way (sidewalk) on the North 9th Street side of the building.
7. Approved a request from the DDA to close the 100 block of S. 11th St. from Ludington St. to 1st Ave. on May 29, 2015, from 11 a.m. to 8 p.m. for the annual Krusin Klassic Rib-Fest event.

### Special Council Meeting, May 13, 2015

1. Approved to accept a proposal from TriMedia Environmental and Engineering of Marquette, MI to update/design a Spill Prevention, Control, and Countermeasures plan for the West Side Substation, the Cold Storage facility, and the new substation in an amount not to exceed \$4,000.00.
2. Approved to purchase wooden distribution poles from Thomasson Company of Philadelphia, MS in the amount of \$37,781.48.
3. Approved to purchase 15kV cable from Border States Electric of Green Bay, WI in an amount not to exceed \$12,000.00.

5. Approved to reinstate the regular purchasing policy for the Electric Department.



City of Escanaba residents are invited to participate in the process of the City of Escanaba government. One of the most effective ways to participate is through service on one of the City's citizen boards, commissions or committees. Through these services, civic minded citizens become involved in their local government and make recommendations to the Escanaba City Council. As a result, the City benefits from the vast knowledge, experience and expertise of its citizens.

Board and commission member positions are all voluntary and are appointed by the Mayor with the consensus of City Council. Once appointed, the time commitment for each board/commission varies, some meet on a regular schedule, others on an as needed basis. Preparation for some meetings may require additional time obligations. Once committed, your attendance at all regularly scheduled meetings is critical.

**How to apply for Boards, Commissions and Committee Appointment:**

Board, Commission and Committee members are appointed by the Mayor with the consensus of the Escanaba City Council.

**To apply:**

1. Review the list of preferences and areas of interest and determine your top choices. Every effort will be made to accommodate your first preference, but vacancies vary and demand for some boards may be higher than others.
2. Complete the required Boards and Commissions Application Form online or mail/fax it, along with your resume to: Office of the City Clerk, P. O. Box 948, 410 Ludington Street, Escanaba, MI 49829 or fax (906) 786-4755 or e-mail to [clerk@escanaba.org](mailto:clerk@escanaba.org).
3. As vacancies occur, applications are reviewed.
4. All members of boards, commissions and committees must be residents of the City of Escanaba, unless directed by the Escanaba City Council to waive the requirement or as specified in the bylaws of the board, commission or committee or as mandated by State Law. Members may not serve more than two full, consecutive terms and are expected to attend all regular and special meetings.
5. Applications will remain on file for one calendar year. A new application is required each year.



## Escanaba Public Library to offer Michigan Activity Pass program with free passes to hundreds of state parks, recreation and cultural destinations throughout Michigan

The Escanaba Public Library will be participating in the Michigan Activity Pass (MAP) program which offers library cardholders at more than 400 participating Michigan libraries a one-day pass to explore—at no cost—hundreds of Michigan’s state parks, historic sites, cultural attractions, campgrounds and recreation areas simply by visiting the Escanaba Public Library or the Michigan Activity Pass website. Beginning May 24, the Michigan Activity Pass will enable library cardholders to print a pass, either from home or the Escanaba Public Library that is valid for one-time entry into any Michigan state park or recreation area and more than 100 participating

cultural institutions, including many museums, for up to one week. Monique Ciofu, Adult Services Librarian said, “We look forward to offering our patrons the Michigan Activity Pass. It’s great to give Escanaba residents another reason to visit the library and experience so much more than they may realize is available to them with their library card.”



The program is supported by Blue Cross Blue Shield of Michigan, the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR), the Michigan Recreation and Park Association (MRPA) and the Library Network. “The Michigan Activity Pass is a great value for our patrons as it encourages people to enjoy some of Michigan’s greatest resources free of charge.” said Jim Pletz, director, The Library Network.
